RAPID VALLEY SANITARY DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING MARCH 11, 2024

Chairman Andy Fitzgerald called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Present at roll call were Bob Phillips, Jennifer Battles, Shirley Haines, Carrie Wheeler, Connie Olson, Eric Krebs, Tim Roth, and Diana Nelson. Also, in attendance were Ted Shultz with Foth Engineering, Casey Skillingstad, and Ron Williams with AE2S Engineering, District Attorney Talbot Wieczorek, Manager Rusty Schmidt, District Clerk Sara Bender.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: A motion was made by Tim Roth to approve the agenda. The motion was seconded by Shirley Haines. Motion carried.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: A motion was made by Connie Olson to approve the minutes from the February meeting. The motion was seconded by Carrie Wheeler. Motion carried unanimously.

APPROVAL OF FINANCE REPORT: The financial reports were distributed to the Trustees for their review prior to the meeting. A motion was made by Diana Nelson to approve the Finance Report. Bob Phillips seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

ITEMS FROM THE PUBLIC: None

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

- 1. <u>Engineer Services for Task Orders on Collection and Reclamation Project Scope:</u> Foth has been contracted to perform the preliminary scope of collection project costs with the focus being on disconnecting of the 19 connection points with the City of Rapid City. This is currently only the planning phase with completion in June. AE2S is contracted to provide the preliminary scope for the reclamation facility costs AE2S is also drafting the CMAR qualifications for advertisement and that is expected to be done by May 1st. At that time, we should have a better idea of a cost estimates so we are able to make an informed decision to move forward with the reclamation facility or continue negotiations with the City.
- **2.** <u>Drinking Water Surcharge Revenue Bond 2023 7th Draw Amount:</u> The 7th draw amount for engineering services with AE2S is \$4183.40 with the total to date of \$522,638.90.

MANAGERS REPORT

3. <u>Monthly Water Loss and Leak Detection:</u> Water loss for February was 11.3%, which is an improvement from last month as well as this time last year. There was a substantial leak found on Helios St that has been repaired. This repair dropped the daily usage for that area substantially. The leak detection trailer is operational and working very effectively. This allows the service team to complete detection a full street at a time without disruption of service for any customers.

PROJECTS AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENT

4. Apple Valley Housing Project Update: Iron Horse Construction has over 2,000 feet of sewer installed on Anderson Rd. Dream Construction has all the water main installed on Long View and will be going south on Anderson Rd. Site Works has started on the interior sewer mains for this development.

OTHER TOPICS

- **SD DANR Approval of RVSD Water System Improvements 2 Million Gallon Storage Reservoir and RVSD Water System Improvements 12" Water Main and Connection to Box Elder:** A preconstruction meeting was held for the 12" water main project. Site Works is expected to start construction in June with completion the end of the summer. The bid opening for the Madison Well was March 6th. There were 3 bidders Hydro Resources, Layne Christensen, and Earth Energy and Water Systems. The engineers estimate for the base project was 2.8 million with alternate 1 bid for sound barriers of \$275,000.00 and alternate 2 for well stimulation of \$200,000.00. Hydro Resources submitted a base bid of 3,197,700.00, alternate 1 of \$210,000.00 and alternate 2 of \$115,000.00. Earth Energy and Water Systems submitted a base bid of \$4,063010.93 alternate 1 \$232,400.00 and alternate 2 \$32,697.00. Layne Christensen submitted a base bid of \$6,593,199.00, alternate 1 \$356,000.00 and alternate 2 \$427,620.00. A motion was made by Connie Olson to approve the bid award to Hydro Resources with a base bid of 3,197,700.00, alternate 1 of \$210,000.00 and alternate 2 of \$115,000.00. The motion was seconded by Carrie Wheeler. Motion carried unanimously.
- **6.** <u>Rapid City Public Works Proposed Rate Increase for Water Reclamation:</u> A motion was made by Connie Olson to move agenda item 6 to executive session. The motion was seconded by Tim Roth. Motion carried unanimously.
- 7. <u>Murphy Ditch Water Rights Inquiry:</u> A meeting was held with Mr. Simunek, the owner of Murphy Ditch water rights. He indicated that he would provide a proposal to bring to the board. Water Rights Division Mark Rath and Nakalia Steen have authorized 110-acre feet for transfer. The manager has had a couple of discussions with Mr. Simunek on price negotiations. The consensus of the trustees was to allow the Manager to continue negotiations.
- **8.** Cost of Services Analysis Contract: AE2S has been working on an updated master plan and updates to our GIS system. This COSA study is pertinent to the growth we are experiencing and the potential increase in large capital projects along with a COSA for Box Elder to determine rates. The cost of this study is approximately \$70,000.00 A motion was made by Shirley Haines to approve the cost of the COSA. The motion was seconded by Eric Krebs. Motion carried unanimously.
- 9. Policy and Investment Committee Recommendations for Changes in Commercial Charges and changes to Ordinance and Policies: The Policy and Investment Committee consisting of Diana Nelson, Connie Olson, Jenny Battles and Tim Roth met on February 28th to review and propose recommendations for changes. Connie Olson presented a summary of changes to the Policy and Procedures Manual, Investment policy and Financial Policy. At the recommendation of the committee, all the proposed changes to the Policy and Procedures Manual, Investment policy and Financial Policy were adopted. The committee also reviewed and has proposed the following changes to Water Use Resolution Attachment A and Sewer Use Resolution Attachment B:
